Music is flourishing, with 27 studying GCSE Music in Year 10, 22 in Year 11, 10 studying AS Music and 8 studying at A Level. This year, we have been able to reintroduce the instrumental programme into Year 8 as well as Year 7. Over the year, all students in these years will have the opportunity to learn an instrument as part of their class Music lesson. This programme was set up several years' ago, thanks to a generous donation from the Haberdashers to purchase class instruments, and a number of students go on to have individual instrumental lessons. Our peripatetic teachers are offering around 170 individual lessons each week. Sadly, we have said goodbye to Mr Clive Rainbow after four and a half years. We have recently appointed a replacement guitar teacher, and Mr Dan Jones will join us in January.




Our Instrumental Programme in progress

Alongside lecturing to undergraduates, Dr Upton worked as a Music Tutor and School Liaison Officer with Nottinghamshire County Council, taught piano and drums to private pupils, and has worked in musical theatre as musical director for various productions. Until recently, he was also an examiner for RSL Awards. Dr Upton plays a variety of instruments: piano, guitar, bass, percussion and saxophone. As an Old Novaportan, Dr Upton is delighted to have returned to his old school and is looking forward to the challenges of running this busy and successful department.



Taiko – Japanese Drumming

Our previous Head of Music, Malcolm Brown, has not cut his ties completely with Haberdashers' Adams. On Wednesday afternoons, he can be found in Hamilton Hall teaching the Senior Taiko group, and in October, he started Junior Taiko as an after-school activity and was amazed by the response. Around 30 pupils in Years 7-10 take part each week in this high-energy, hands-on, fun activity. Previous Senior Taiko groups have played for Prince Edward, when he came to open the Coach House, led the parade in the Lord Mayor's Show in London, playing on the top of a double-decker bus, and taken part in the National Taiko Festival. A new year, a new show.....

Our shows are usually planned a year in advance, but the arrival of Covid delayed our scheduled production of West Side Story by two years – by which time, the majority of the students taking part had left Adams (a number of whom have gone on to study Drama or Musical Theatre). We have, therefore, chosen a different show with the current cohort of thespians in mind, and our production in July 2022 will be Sweeney Todd – the Demon Barber of Fleet Street. Based on the well-known story, this is a dark and dramatic production, with some great music. Described as 'a dark and witty tale of London, love, murder and revenge', Sweeney Todd has music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim, one of the most famous figures in 20th century musical theatre, who died in recently at the age of 91. Rehearsals for our production are already underway, directed by Dr Upton and Mr Hickey.
