#### **Theatre Armourer**

An Armourer is in charge of the firearms and blades used in a theatre production. They can also be responsible for pyrotechnics (any special effects using heat, light, gas, smoke or sound) and theatrical trickery.

The role involves elements of engineering, pyrotechnics, carpentry and mechanics. Armourers will work on theatre productions but are also required for film and TV productions. They are normally self-employed and require excellent communication skills, good attention to details and the ability to work as part of a team.
